Course Objective

This course is designed to provide basic technical, artistic, and theoretical instruction used in the creation of digital photographic imagery. Technical and aesthetic issues will be discussed throughout the class. The course will provide technical instruction concerning camera operation, basic image processing using Adobe Lightroom software, image printing and presentation. This class is taught in B&W.

Assignments

Assignments will consist of individual projects performed outside of class meeting times.

- 1) 12 Hours (Camera Operation)
- 2) Adjectives (Theme & Variations)
- 3) Get Lost (Composition)
- 4) Home Is Where the Heart Is (Environmental Portrait)
- 5) Head Trip (Traditional Portrait (½, ¼, head))
- 6) Space, I Can Believe In (Landscape)
- 7) Open

Tests and quizzes will also be used to evaluate student understanding of all aspects of photography taught during the course.

You are also required to attend a Photography Exhibition and write a one page commentary.

- The due date is always part of the assignment.
